## **A BALDWIN SCHOOL ATHLETE**

Baldwin School athletes come in any shape, size, and color. There is no common denominator except a love for sports and a desire to get the most out of their abilities. They're not only proud of their strengths, but understand their weaknesses. Their first concern is with the good of the team and they know that individual recognition will come through team excellence.

A Baldwin School athlete should have enthusiasm, the discipline, heart, and never loses honesty or character.

Baldwin School athletes appreciate the support of all the fans, but they are much more aware of the example they are setting for some small child watching from the sideline. They are happy when they score but never forget that a teammate passed them the ball. It is our hope to accomplish this objective through this athletic handbook for students, parents and coaches.

## **PURPOSE OF ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES:**

Baldwin School of Puerto Rico provides a diverse interscholastic athletic and activities program intended to enrich and enhance our academic programs. Athletics and activities are the other half of education and should provide a wholesome environment for the development of teamwork, school spirit, individual skills and self esteem for student athletes through competition. We want our students to be strong in many areas: *'Multa Bene Facta,'* many things done well. We want to combine a commitment to excellence with the search for victory.

## **DEFINITION OF ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES:**

Activities referred to in this handbook are those individual or group co-curricular activities which extend, support, intensify and motivate students to achieve in the core-curriculum. These activities should also provide opportunities for enrichment, skill development, and personal growth beyond those available in the classroom. Co-curricular activities are those for which a student receives no evaluation in letter grades, represents Baldwin School in an official capacity and/or competes with other schools and which generally occur outside the classroom.

## **GOALS FOR BALDWIN SCHOOL ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES:**

Baldwin School of PR Athletics and Activities Program will:

1. Enhance and expand the learning experiences of the classroom.
2. Provide opportunities for students to experience social phenomena such as public performance, cooperation, teamwork, and interaction with fellow students and adults.
3. Enhance student pride and identification with friends, school, and the community.
4. Increase student morale and motivation for achievement and skill development in the academic, physical, and social realms.
5. Elevate the standards of good sportsmanship and encourage the growth of good citizenship.
6. Enhance the development of a positive self-image in each student.
7. Increase student experience in meeting challenges and coping with success and failure.
8. Meet the needs of students rather than the needs of teachers, coaches, administrators, parents, or the world at large.
9. Provide reflection and feedback in order to maximize learning and growth.
10. Provide guidance in the individual's selection and number of activities in which they participate in order to best meet life-long as well as immediate needs of students.

## **GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE**

While it is hoped that all athletes, parents and staff members work for the common good of the individual and the school, disagreements are a part of high school athletics. For the purpose of improving relations between all parties involved, the following guidelines shall be followed:

1. If a parent has a complaint about a coach, they shall refrain from confronting the coach at any officially recognized team activity. Complaints shall be addressed to the Athletic Director. The AD will then establish a conference where all parties will be in attendance.
2. If the situation is not resolved, then an administrator will be present to assess the situation.
3. The student shall not be involved in any discussion.
3. No other student/athlete shall be mentioned in any meeting.
4. It is up to the individual coach to determine playing time for team members. The criteria for playing time includes but is not determined by: ability, experience, work ethic, attitude and past performance.

## **AHLETIC & ACTIVITIES ELIGIBILITY POLICY:**

Most Baldwin School of PR students are eligible to participate in the athletic activities sponsored by Baldwin School of PR. A student will become ineligible under the following conditions:

- Any student who has a Grade Average of less than **C-** at the end of a quarter will become ineligible to play/practice for the next 4 weeks. Upon the end of that 4 week period a progress report will be issued to check if the student is capable of returning to the team.
- Any student who is new at the school and started in grades 10-12 at Baldwin are ineligible to play for one full school year, as stated by league policy.
- Any student-athlete who misses practice without a valid excuse may be suspended from league play at the coaches' or athletic director's discretion (school work or tests are not an excuse to miss a practice or a game, all student-athletes must find their own free time to do their respective school work)

## **ATHLETE, COACH AND PARENT BEHAVIOR**

We expect our athletes to compete with the highest level of sportsmanship, fair play and excitement. Our athletes are expected to behave at a higher level than our opponents. If any student/athlete is ejected, by their behavior, in or near any altercation, the coach, Athletic Director or Principal can suspend the student for the time allotted by the PRHSAA or LAMEPI, or any time longer as deemed appropriate by the school.

No student will be allowed to participate in athletics under the effects of mood altering or performance altering substances (i.e. - alcohol, marijuana, steroids). Any student who is guilty of the use of mood or performance altering substances will be subject to the proper reprimand as listed in the school handbook. Any student allegedly accused of using mood

and performance altering substances will be given due process in complete accordance with the law.

Any coach or parent that behaves in a manner not acceptable by the Baldwin School of Puerto Rico can be suspended from attending any official athletic activity. This negative behavior includes, but is not limited to: verbal abuse, gross misconduct, actions under the influence of narcotics, or alcohol, and berating of officials, coaches, players or people in attendance.

### **UNIFORMS:**

Baldwin School of PR will furnish most uniforms used for official competition. Sponsors for uniforms are welcome. If you or your parent wishes to sponsor or donate uniforms for a specific team, please contact the team's coach or the athletic director.

### **MINIMUM ROSTER REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION:**

If three weeks prior to a regular season opener, the team is unable to meet the required roster limit for that league event as published in the constitution, that team will not travel to team competitions in that sport or level.

### **ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT ATHLETES / PARENTS SCHOOL AGREEMENT:**

All students, before participating in a Baldwin School of PR sport, must have on file with the coach a completed and signed Athletic Department Athletes / Parents School Agreement.

### **PARTICIPATION AND STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY**

No student shall practice or participate in two or more team sports concurrently; special cases must be cleared by the coach and the athletic director. One sports season must be completed before the next may be practiced or played. This applies to grades 4-12. Special cases will be considered by the coaches and the athletic director. Team sports include: Volleyball, Soccer, Basketball, Indoor Soccer, Baseball and Softball. A student may participate in one team sport and one individual sport in a season. Individual sports include: Golf, Tennis, Swimming, Cross Country, Track & Field & Wrestling.

### **SUSPENDED STUDENTS**

Students who are suspended will not be allowed to participate in Baldwin School of PR activities or sports for the duration of their suspension.

## **SPORTS BANQUET**

Each year, Baldwin School of PR sponsors the Sports Banquet to honor all participants in those sports in which she or he participated. It is expected that all coaches and participating students will attend this banquet and awards ceremony.

## **COACHES' RESPONSIBILITIES**

1. The Head Coach of each sport will set the rules for that team. Each coach will provide his/her team with the guidelines and standards for instruction in each sport.
2. The coach will receive a final schedule with all the home and away games.
3. The coach will be responsible for:
  - a. Equipment used for practices and games
  - b. Making sure facilities are left clean and organized following practices and games.
  - c. Students' behavior at all times while under his/her supervision.
  - d. Setting and distributing a practice schedule.
  - e. The dismissal and supervision of team members while waiting for the bus.
  - f. Traveling on the bus with the students.
  - g. Reporting accidents immediately to Athletic Director.
  - h. Making a student directory that includes parents / guardians' phone numbers to be contacted in case of an emergency.
  - i. Attending all meetings set by the sport's commissioner.
  - j. Submit nominations at meetings for All Star and All Alliance selections.
  - k. Deliver score sheets for each game to the Athletic Director.
  - l. Report to the Athletic Director the same day, cases where any team member is ejected from a game and/or is involved in any disciplinary violation before, during or after a game.
  - m. Distributing and collecting uniforms.
  - n. Distributing and returning the Parents-Athletes-School Agreement forms. Such form **MUST** be completed, signed and delivered to the Athletic Director prior to the first competition date.
  - o. Completing the Eligibility Roster according to standards.
  - p. Having a First Aid kit during each game.

## **INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES AFFILIATION**

Baldwin School of PR is a member of the Puerto Rico High School Athletic Alliance (PRHSAA). Members schools include St. Johns (Condado), Ramey School (Aguadilla), Commonwealth High School (Hato Rey), University High School (Rio Piedras), Palmas Academy (Humacao), Notre Dame (Caguas), Antilles High School (Ft. Buchanan), American Military (Guaynabo), and many others. Regular PRHSAA competitions are held in sports and are generally hosted by member schools and follow strict rules.

No student who is on probation will be allowed to represent PRHSAA sponsored activities, as stated by school policy.

### ATHLETES – PARENTS SCHOOL AGREEMENT

1. All athletes are required to abide by the school's policies.
2. All athletes are required to abide by the L.A.M.E.P.I. and P.R.H.S.A.A. **Rules and Regulations.**
3. Being a team member representing BALDWIN is a privilege, **not a right.**
4. As a **student – athlete** representing BALDWIN, you will demonstrate proper behavior and respect for others. You will comply with the instructions given by the coach at all times.
5. The coach will determine the amount of time that a particular athlete plays in a game.
6. Any issues parents may have with coaches will be managed by the Athletic Director. No parent will accost a coach before, during or after any organized team activity (i.e.- practices, games, tournaments).
7. The student – athlete who decides to quit the team without a valid reason will not be eligible to participate in other sports for the remainder of the **school year**. The athlete will not receive any kind of recognition at the annual Sports Banquet Ceremony.
8. Any athlete on academic or social probation will not be allowed to participate in sports during his/her probation: unless cleared with the Director.
9. If a student is absent from three classes or more, he/she cannot participate in either games or practices during that particular day.
10. The athlete will attend all practices and games, unless previously cleared with the coach.
11. It is the student's responsibility to contact his/her teacher if he/she needs to reschedule a test because of a game.
12. The athlete will travel with the team utilizing the round trip transportation provided by the school. Students driving their own cars will not be allowed to participate unless previously coordinated with the Athletic Director and authorized in writing by parent/guardian.
13. The uniforms must be returned to school cleaned and in good condition when the sport season is over. If not, athletes will be required to pay the cost of the uniform in full.

Maps to PRHSAA and LAMEPI Schools

The following schools are part of the PRHSAA and LAMEPI sports programs, and their respective locations for away games. In the following pages, maps for certain schools are placed by numbers in the following order:

1. Baldwin
2. AMA (American Military Academy) –  
From Baldwin front gate, take a right (east) on Avenida A. Follow towards Rt 177. Take a right at Clínica Las Américas, keep going straight into the school.
3. MAR (Marista) –  
From Baldwin School back gate, take a left (east) on Avenida Santa Ana. After passing Plaza Alta, take a left into Marista.
4. CSI (Colegio San Ignacio) –  
From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. Pass over the Martínez Nadal freeway (Rt.20), then 4 streetlights to Calle Sauco (*after* the gas station on your left and Burger King on your right). Make a left on Sauco and go to the end of the street.
5. MR (María Reina) –  
From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. Pass over the Martínez Nadal freeway (Rt.20), then 3 streetlights to Avenida Glasgow (the gas station on your left and Burger King on your right). Take a left on Glasgow and follow to María Reina on your right.
6. PRK (Parkville School) –  
From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. Pass over the Martínez Nadal freeway (Rt.20), then 3 streetlights to Avenida Glasgow (the gas station on your left and Burger King on your right). Turn right on Mejico street (Burger King). Follow to left on Harding Street, then Parkville School at the end on Alabama.
7. WES (Wesleyan Academy) –  
From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. Pass over the Martínez Nadal freeway (Rt.20), then 5 streetlights to Alejandrino Avenue (Blockbuster and Dunkin Donuts on your right). Take a right on Alejandrino (south) and follow to Wesleyan on left (east) side.
8. AHS (Antillas Elementary, Middle and Upper School) –  
From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. After the second streetlight, take exit on right side towards Martínez Nadal Freeway (second exit, over the bridge, north towards San Patricio). Stay on right lane when close to the streetlight after San Patricio exit. After streetlight (take the first exit towards Avenida Roosevelt). Turn left at the first streetlight, and turn left quickly to go under the Carretera #2 bridge. At the streetlight, go straight towards Fort Buchanan. The schools are located inside the base.

9. BEL (Belén) –

From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. After the second streetlight, take exit on right side towards Martínez Nadal Freeway (second exit, over the bridge, north towards San Patricio). Take first exit towards Avenida Piñero / Central. Turn right (east) on Avenida Central / Piñero. At the first big intersection take a left (north) towards Avenida San Patricio. Once you reach the first streetlight, turn left on Jacinto Galib. Belén is directly ahead.

10. BON (Bonneville) & 11. PRO (Providencia)

From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east towards Cupey. Go almost all the way to the end, past Rt.1 and Rt.52 (Freeways). After you pass Señorial (located on your right), keep going until you reach 8176 North. Turn left, Bonneville is located on your right, quickly followed by Providencia.

12. CUP (Cupeyville) –

From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east towards Cupey. Go almost all the way to the end, past Rt.1 and Rt.52 (Freeways). After you pass Señorial (located on your right), keep going until you reach 176 North (end of road). Take left on 176 (north). Turn left on 3rd streetlight (Cupey Bowl, after Faccio Pizza). Turn right on next streetlight (cemetery), the school is located after the cemetery.

13. STJ (St. Johns) & 14. ROB (Robinson) –

From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. After the second streetlight, take exit on right side towards Martínez Nadal Freeway (second exit, over the bridge, north towards San Patricio). After streetlight (in which Rt.20 becomes CARR #2). Take CARR#2 to the second exit (Expressway De Diego towards Plaza Las Américas). At Plaza, stay to the left on Rt.22 (Freeway) to merge with Rt. 18 (towards Carolina). Stay on Rt22 towards tunnel. Once you reach the tunnel, stay on the left lane and take last exit on left towards Old San Juan (Rt26 west). Take the first exit off 26 (RH Todd Ave, Condado Centro). At the first opportunity, take a sharp right on Wilson. Take the second left on Cervantes, then the 2nd right on Magdalena. Follow Magdalena until it merges with Ashford Avenue. You will see a parking garage with a Starbucks, Pizzeria Uno's and Fuddruckers. Park here, St. Johns and Robinson are right across the street.

15. CHS (Commonwealth High School), 16. La Merced Soccer Park –

From Baldwin front gate, take a right to 177 east. After the second streetlight, take exit on right side towards Martínez Nadal Freeway (second exit, over the bridge, north towards San Patricio). After streetlight (in which Rt.20 becomes CARR #2). Take CARR#2 to the second exit (Expressway De Diego towards Plaza Las Américas). At Plaza, stay to the right on Rt.22 (Freeway) towards Plaza, Stadium and Caguas. Take the exit towards Domenech Avenue (just after the baseball stadium), and turn left towards Domenech. For La Merced soccer park, turn left on the first streetlight (Gulf station) and go all the way to the end to reach the park. For CHS, turn left on the second streetlight (La Viña Bakery and Café). Do not turn 90 degrees left towards Cesar Gonzalez Avenue, but turn 45 degrees left to Octavio Marcano street. This street will lead you straight into the CHS softball field, which is the back part of the school.
